Representing place value

Use sticks and leaves to represent 2 digit numbers

*e.g. 1 stick = a ten, 1 leaf = a unit/one
23 = 2 sticks and 3 leaves.*

Challenge activity - find something you could use to represent hundreds so you can make 3 digit numbers.

Invent a woodland creature

Look at some pictures of real woodland creatures.
Invent your own creature. You could draw it and label it or you could make a model.

Challenge activity - write a diary entry about the day you discovered this woodland creature whilst camping in the woods.

Make a map of the woods

Your map could be of an imaginary or real woodland.

Add landmarks to your map.

Challenge activity - write about the people/animals who live there.
